

Drive-In General Info

Q: What is the Crime Stoppers' Drive-In Concert?

A: The Drive-In Concert is a drive-in concert at Hammond Square. It offers an opportunity to enjoy live music while maintaining safe social distancing guidelines. The concert will be held in the parking lot in front of East of Italy and Nagoya Restaurants.

Q: What safety precautions are being taken?

A: All CDC and State of Louisiana guidelines will be followed, and we are working closely with Hammond City and the Office of the State Fire Marshall to ensure this event meets or exceeds all recommended standards.

Q: What time is the concert?

A: The venue will open at 4:30pm and the performance will run from 6:30pm – 9:30pm. Once the show concludes, all vehicles will be directed to exit the site. No vehicles will be permitted to stay on property and continue socializing.

Q: Does everyone in a vehicle need a ticket?

A: No. A Car Pass covers entry for your vehicle and occupants. Occupancy is limited to the number of legal seats in each vehicle, and those who do not follow this rule will be turned away at the gate.

Q: How much do Car Passes cost?

A: GA Car Passes are \$50 and VIP Car Passes are \$75.

Q: Can I buy tickets at the show?

A: yes, but space is limited. It's encouraged to purchase prior to concert day.

Q: What will my parking space look like?

A: Each space is the size of an average parking space.

Q: How will I hear the show?

A: The stage will be equipped with a normal festival-style sound system, so you can enjoy the show outside your vehicle in your assigned spot.

Q: How are spaces allocated, and what's the difference between GA and VIP?

A: The front two rows of the venue are reserved for VIP Car Pass holders. Purchase of a VIP Car Pass guarantees you a spot in the first two rows from the stage, but location within the first 2 rows will be determined by first come, first parked. The remaining rows are for GA Car Pass holders and are also first come, first parked, starting at the third row.

Q: Can I bring my own food and beverage?

A: Yes! In an effort to limit person-to-person contact, concessions will not be available. Hammond Square restaurants are encouraged to provide takeout meals for concert guests. You are welcome to bring your own pre-cooked food and non-glass beverages. On site cooking, including open flames, grills and BBQ pits are prohibited.

Q: Will restrooms be provided?

A: Yes, portable restrooms will be provided. PLEASE NOTE: When traveling to and from restroom facilities, guests are required to wear a mask and maintain social distancing. Your safety is our priority and for that reason, restrooms facilities will be sanitized frequently..

Q: What are the allowed and prohibited items for this event?

A: The following items are allowed:

- Binoculars
- Non-aerosol Bug Spray
- Cameras (cameras with detachable zoom lenses are prohibited)
- Cans
- Coolers
- Food
- Lawn Chairs
- Umbrellas (small/personal size)
- Water Bottles

The following items are prohibited:

- Animals/Pets (service animals are permitted)
- Audio or Video Recording of any kind
- Cameras with detachable zoom lenses
- Drones
- Fireworks/Noisemakers
- Generators
- Glass Bottles
- Grills/BBQ Pits
- Illegal Drugs
- Inflatables
- Kerosene lamps or open flame of any kind
- Laser pointers
- Littering
- Selfie Sticks
- Signs/Banners/Flags
- Spike Jewelry
- Tents
- Large Umbrellas
- Weapons

Q: Where do I enter?

A: The entrance on C.M. Fagan Drive.

Each vehicle, upon arrival, will be greeted by our volunteers. Vehicles will be screened by security and police representatives. Please have your ticket readily available to present.

Q: Can I bring a large vehicle?

A: No. Buses, large trucks, recreational vehicles, limousines and other oversized vehicles are not permitted.

Q: Do I have to bring a vehicle, or can I walk in?

A: In order to maintain our social distancing responsibilities, all guests must arrive in a vehicle. Ride-shares and drop-offs will not be permitted.

Q: Can I enjoy the show outside of my car?

A: Yes, as long as you maintain social distancing.

Q: Can I roam around?

A: yes, please but please maintain social distancing.

Q: Can I leave in the middle of the show and come back?

A: No. Re-entry is not permitted.

Q: Can I save a parking space for my friends?

A: Spaces cannot be reserved. If you would like to park next to another vehicle, please arrive together and remember to follow social distancing guidelines at all times when parked.

Q: Can I leave my car running?

A: Cars will need to be turned off once you are parked. We suggest that you only run your engine as needed. Please be courteous to those around you.

Q: What if I have an emergency?

A: Security, medical and police staff will all be onsite and available to assist. Upon entry, we will provide you with a text-line number to text in the event that you need immediate assistance. If for some reason you have an emergency and need to leave, please let us know so that we can assist.

Q: What if stay at home orders are extended?

A: As long as we all follow the rules set forth by our state and local communities, hosting this event falls within the current guidelines.

Q: Are masks required?

A: Yes. Masks are required for fans and staff, unless you are in your designated space. If you leave that space to use the restroom, you are required to wear a mask. You must utilize a mask upon arrival in order to safely communicate with ticketing and parking attendants.

Q: My battery dies while on site. Will assistance be available?

A: We will have a service available to assist if needed.
